

Esports Fundamentals

Core Terminology

Esports	Organized, competitive video gaming, often at a professional level.
MMO	Massively Multiplayer Online game. Games with large persistent worlds and player bases.
MOBA	Multiplayer Online Battle Arena. Team-based strategy games with hero characters.
FPS	First-Person Shooter. Shooter games played from a first-person perspective.
RTS	Real-Time Strategy. Strategy games where players make decisions simultaneously.
APM	Actions Per Minute. A measure of a player's speed and efficiency.
Meta	The dominant strategies, characters, or items in the current game environment.
LAN	Local Area Network. A local network, often used for tournaments to minimize lag.

Common Esports Jargon

Gank	A surprise attack, often involving multiple players.
Buff	An improvement to a character's or item's stats or abilities.
Nerf	A reduction to a character's or item's stats or abilities.
Carry	A player or character who is responsible for dealing significant damage and winning the game.
Tilt	A state of frustration or anger that negatively impacts a player's performance.
OP	Overpowered. Too strong compared to other options.

Game Genres & Key Titles

MOBA (Multiplayer Online Battle Arena)

Team-based strategy games where players control a single character ('hero') with unique abilities, aiming to destroy the opposing team's base.

FPS (First-Person Shooter)

Fast-paced, action-oriented games where players view the world through the eyes of their character and compete in various modes, such as team deathmatch or objective-based scenarios.

Fighting Games

Head-to-head combat games emphasizing precise timing, execution, and character knowledge.

RTS (Real-Time Strategy)

Strategy games where players manage resources, build bases, and command units in real-time to defeat their opponents.

Battle Royale

Games where large numbers of players compete to be the last one standing on a shrinking map.
Key Titles: <ul style="list-style-type: none">FortniteApex LegendsPUBG: Battlegrounds

Esports Roles & Strategies

Common Team Roles (Examples from MOBA/FPS)

Carry/Damage Dealer	Focuses on dealing high damage output to eliminate enemies.
Support	Provides utility, healing, and protection to teammates.
Tank	Absorbs damage and protects the team's damage dealers.
Initiator/Engager	Starts fights and creates opportunities for the team.
Flanker	Attacks from unexpected angles to disrupt the enemy.
Sniper	Engages enemies from long distances.

Drafting Phase (MOBA Example)

The drafting phase is a critical stage where teams select and ban characters to create a favorable team composition and counter the opponent's picks.
Understanding hero matchups, team synergies, and the current meta is crucial for making informed decisions during the draft.
Teams often prioritize picking strong meta heroes, securing key roles, and denying powerful characters from the opponent.
